

Omni CRA Future Leaders Scholarship Program

Introduction

The Omni Redevelopment District Community Redevelopment Agency (Omni CRA) is proud to introduce the "Omni CRA Future Leaders Scholarship Program," an educational initiative dedicated to empowering the residents within the Omni Redevelopment Area. Rooted in the principles of equity, education, and economic advancement, this program reflects the CRA's ongoing commitment to breaking down barriers to opportunity and fostering a more vibrant and self-sufficient community.

In alignment with the goals outlined in the 2019 Omni Redevelopment Plan, the scholarship program aims to support local students in their pursuit of higher education, vocational training, or accredited certificate programs. Education and skill development are key components in promoting sustainable economic growth and enhancing the quality of life for Omni residents. This program not only addresses those goals but also encourages recipients to remain connected to their community by providing insight and feedback on the role and future of the CRA.

Through a competitive application process, eligible residents will have the opportunity to receive the scholarship to support tuition and related expenses over two academic semesters. The program includes two funding categories: Category 1 for students enrolled in colleges or universities, and Category 2 for those pursuing vocational or certificate-based education.

The Omni CRA believes in nurturing local talent, supporting career readiness, and encouraging community engagement. This scholarship program is a tangible expression of those beliefs, ensuring that the next generation of leaders has the tools and support necessary to thrive.

Eligibility Criteria

To qualify for the Omni CRA Future Leaders Scholarship Program, applicants must meet the following requirements:

1. Residency

o Applicants must reside within the boundaries of the Omni Redevelopment Area.

2. Enrollment

- o Must provide proof of acceptance or enrollment in an accredited:
 - College or university.
 - Vocational training program.
 - Accredited certificate program.



3. Academic Requirements

College/University Applicants:

- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher (to qualify for second disbursement).
- Must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits per semester.

o Vocational/Certificate Program Applicants:

 Must demonstrate satisfactory academic progress according to program standards.

4. Income Verification

- o Applicants must provide household income documentation.
- o Income must be within guidelines consistent with FAFSA standards for financial need (required for University/College Applicants).

5. Essay or Video Submission

- o College/University Applicants: Submit a five-page essay (see rubric below).
- Vocational/Certificate Applicants: Submit a 10-minute video (see rubric below).

6. Academic Field Preferences

 Preference will be given to students pursuing careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, or Mathematics (STEM).

7. Institutional Preference

Preference will be given to students attending institutions within Miami-Dade County or the State of Florida.

8. Conduct

o Any use of plagiarism, cheating, or AI-generated content in submissions will result in immediate disqualification.

Application Components

- 1. Completed application form.
- 2. Proof of residency (utility bill, lease agreement, etc.).
- 3. Proof of enrollment or acceptance.
- 4. Most recent academic transcript.
- 5. Essay or video submission.
- 6. Household income verification (e.g., tax returns, W-2, FAFSA).

Award Details

- Up to \$10,000 per eligible applicant.
- Supports up to two academic semesters.
- Disbursement may be made directly to the institution or reimbursed to the student with proper documentation.
- Funds not claimed within the award period may be reallocated.

Program Administration

- Applications will be reviewed by the Omni CRA or designated evaluators.
- Final decisions rest with the Executive Director of the Omni CRA.
- All materials submitted become the property of the Omni CRA and will not be returned.
- Disbursement is subject to availability of funds and budget allocations.

Key Dates (Tentative)

- Application Launch: August 5, 2025.
- Application Deadline: Rolling deadline based on available funds.
- Award Notifications: Notifications in one month or thereafter.
